Total eight winners are awarded with cash prize and trophy in two categories. Pre revenue category and Revenue category



2. Brief proceeding of the event:

A Professional & field visit to botanical garden to botany department of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad was organized by Medicinal garden cell for Students of 2nd, 3rd and final year were visited to different sections of the department, which includes tissue culture laboratory, herbarium store, Mushroom cultivation department and botanical garden.


Introductory session started by Ms (Dr.) Pooja Sawant Research scholar explained detailed about Biotechnology in that specifically tissue culture, Researchers prepare the growth medium using aseptic techniques, ensuring it has all the necessary nutrients and supplements for cell growth. What is the tissue culture, Which precaution were taken during preparation of medium, How aseptically handle all the process of preparation of tissue culture. Which are different medium used in preparation of TC. How its useful to preserve endangered species by using TC techniques. The cultures are placed in incubators with controlled temperature, humidity, and CO₂ levels. Researchers regularly monitor the cultures, checking for contamination and ensuring optimal conditions for cell growth


In tissue culture laboratory Mr. (Dr.) Vaibhav Misal Research scholar, explained detailed about tissue culture in simple language, preparations and types of media required for Preparation of tissue culture. he also explained about startup of small scale tissue culture laboratory. As the cells multiply, they need to be transferred to new dishes or flasks with fresh growth medium. This process is called sub culturing.

In second session Mr. Sumit Chavan explained about internationally recognized herbarium store, preparation of the herbarium, procedure, importance, authentication of the unknown species, also provided the information regarding Flora of Marathwada. Creating and

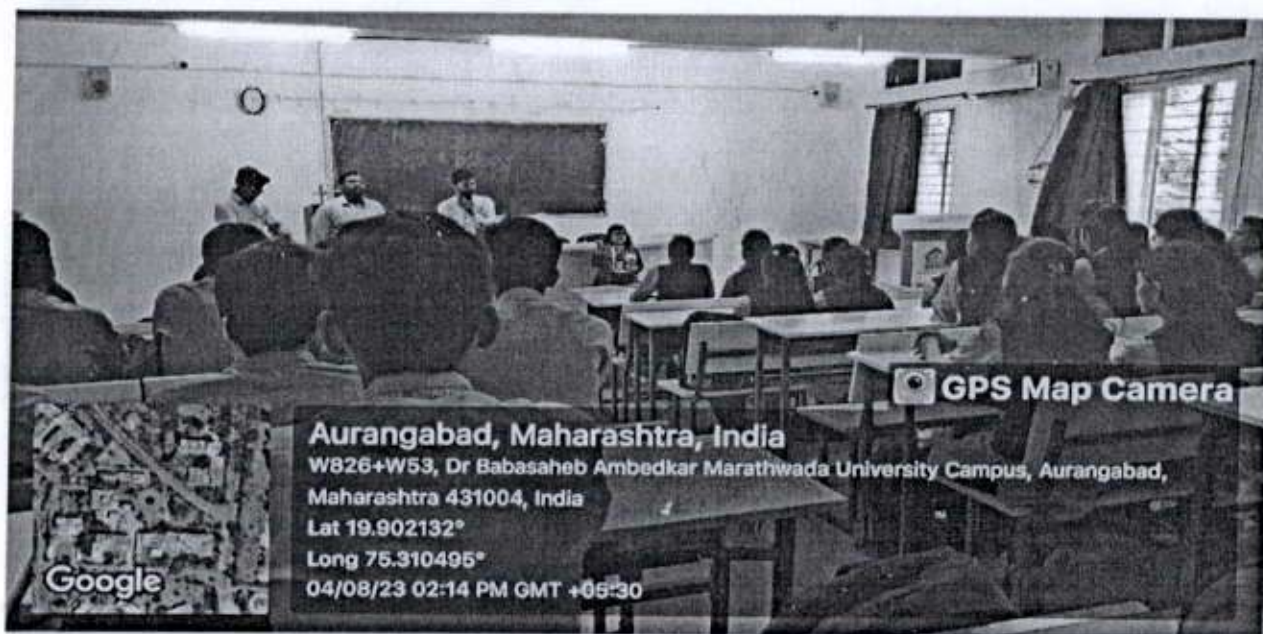

maintaining herbarium sheets involves collecting, preserving, and organizing plant specimens for future reference and research. Here's a step-by-step guide on how to prepare and maintain herbarium sheets:


In Third session Mr. Abhishek Raut Research scholar explained detailed about Mushroom cultivation, Different types of mushroom, edible and non edible mushroom, how they are cultivated in laboratories. He also gave the information on their research work of edible mushroom for malnourish child for fulfillment of their nutritional requirement by using mushroom powder.

Mr. Sunil Gawali explained the botanical garden, which is having number of medicinal plant, he described uses of medicinal plants, names in different languages ,nomenclature and identification as per their organoleptic characters, methods of ploughing. He gave the information regarding elephant foot plant (*Amorphophallus paeoniifolius*)and its medicinal benefits like Lowers Cholesterol, Brings Down Inflammation, Slows Down Ageing, Regulates Blood Sugar, Flushes Out Toxins, Improves Cognitive Functioning, Triggers Immunity, Maintains Hormonal Balance etc.

Spectroscopy, DSC. The field visit was a fantastic learning opportunity to learn how to handle such sophisticated instruments.


Students were actively engaged during this session. Question answer session was also followed after visiting each section of the visit.




2. Brief description of the activity conducted:

It provides valuable insights into patients' allergic tendencies, adherence to pharmacological and non-pharmacological treatments, social drug use and probable self-medication with complementary and alternative medicines. Interviewing a patient in collecting the data medical history is called medication history interview.

The objectives of a patient medication history form are to gather comprehensive and accurate information about a patient's current and past medications. This includes prescription medications, over-the-counter drugs, herbal supplements, and any other substances the patient may be taking. The form aims to document the name of the medication, dosage, frequency, duration of use, and any known allergies or adverse reactions. By collecting this information, healthcare providers can make informed decisions about the patient's treatment plan, identify potential drug interactions or contraindications, and ensure patient safety. Additionally, the medication history form helps in monitoring medication adherence and tracking changes in the patient's medication regimen over time.

Total 49 Students participated in collecting the patient medication history interview.

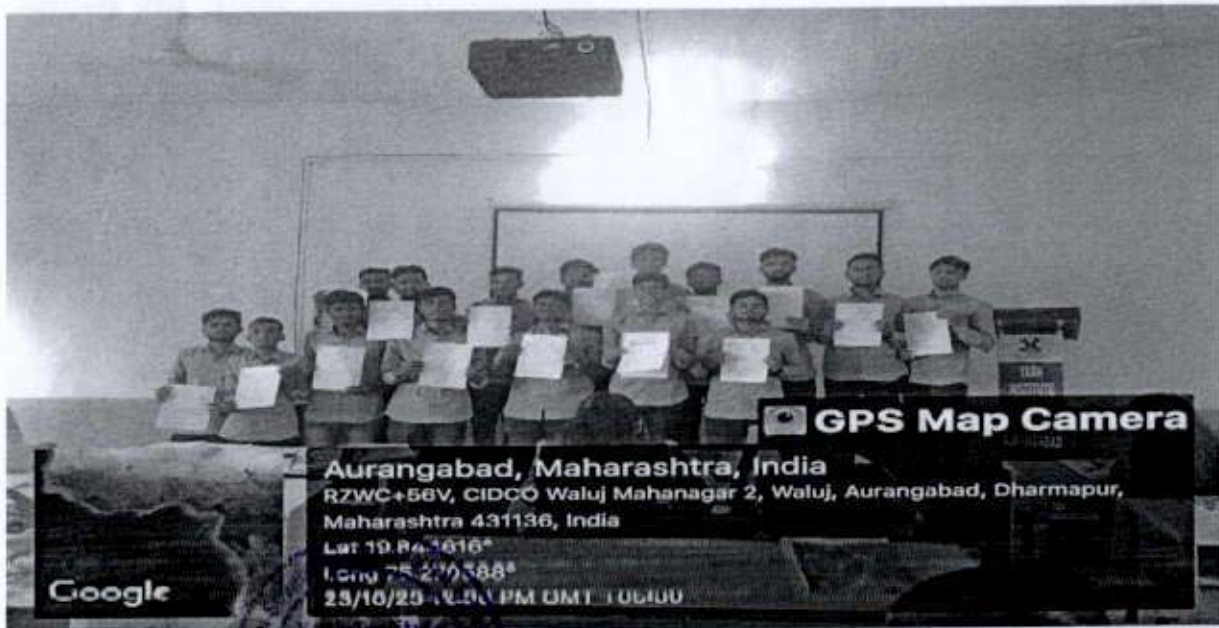
3. Impact of the activity (Outcomes for students and/or staff):

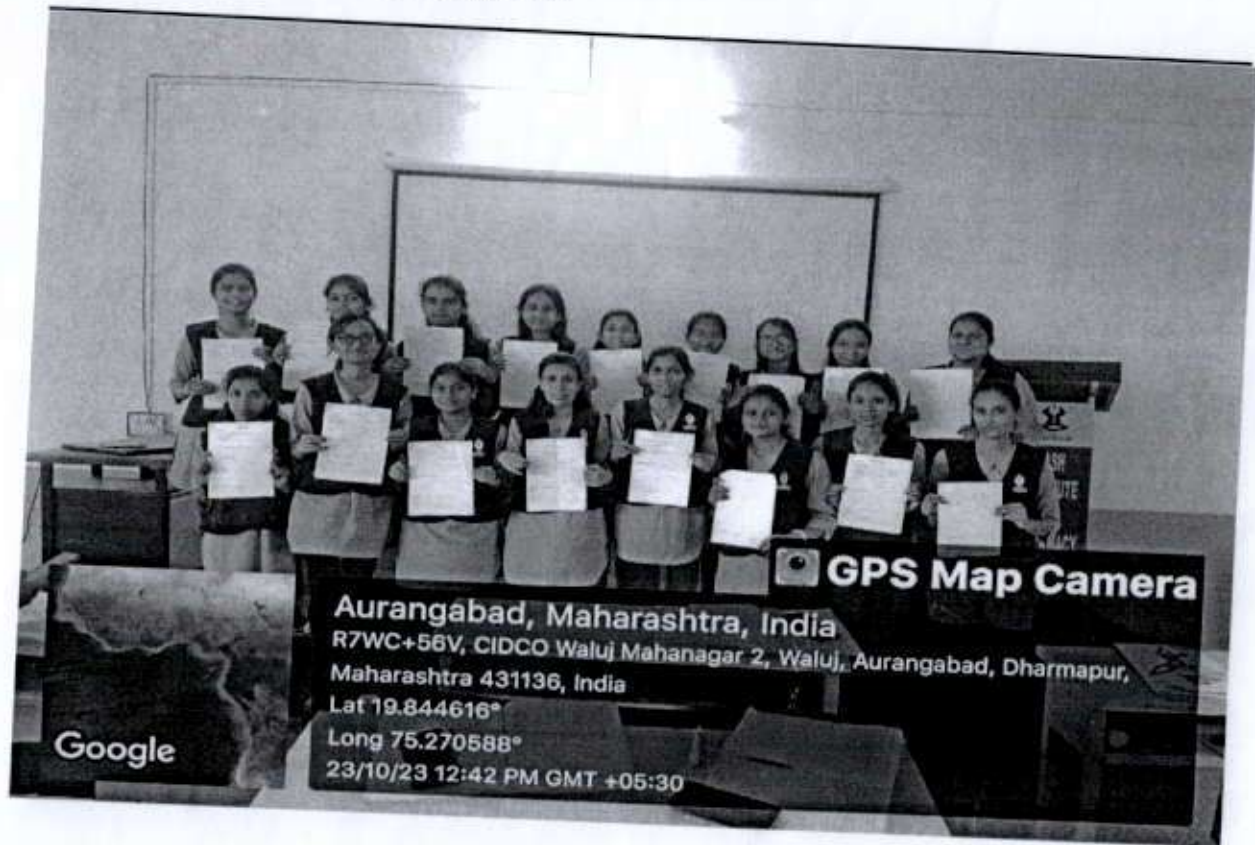

Chemical Reactions

- 1) Nitration:** Pyrrole reacts with $\text{HNO}_3/\text{H}_2\text{SO}_4$ at -15°C to form 2-nitropyrrole.
- 2) Bromination:** Pyrrole reacts with Br_2 in CH_2Cl_2 to form 2,5-dibromopyrrole.
- 3) Iodination:** Pyrrole reacts with I_2 in CH_2Cl_2 to form 2,5-diiodopyrrole.
- 4) Chlorination:** Pyrrole reacts with PCl_5 to form 2-chloropyrrole.
- 5) Sulfonation:** Pyrrole reacts with SO_3 in pyridine to form pyrrole-2-sulphonic acid.
- 6) Gattermann-Koch Synthesis:** Pyrrole reacts with CO , HCl , and HNO_3 to form 2-pyrrole-carbonyl chloride.
- 7) Friesel-Crafts Acylation:** Pyrrole reacts with COCl_2 in Et_3N to form 2-acetylpyrrole.
- 8) Reduction:** Pyrrole is reduced to pyrrolidine using H_2 and Ni , or to 2,5-dihydropyrrole using Zn .
- 9) Reaction with maleic anhydride:** Pyrrole reacts with maleic anhydride to form 2-(1-pyrrolyl)indane-1,4-dicarboxylic acid.

Medicinal Uses

- 1. Carboprostalol:** An anticholinergic drug used in peptic ulcers.
- 2. Atropine:** Used in the management of high cholesterol and high blood pressure.
- 3. Pilocarpine:** Important for maintaining corneal tissue & skin damage; important for pupal functioning as a job & light; increases the antimicrobial action, enhances pupal activity.
- 4. Atropine:** Used for treating respiratory depression, increases withdrawal symptoms, induces stimulation & pleasure, reduces stress and enhances focus/attention.
- 5. Pilocarpine:** Anticholinergic drug used to treat the stiffness of muscles (Parkinson's movement).

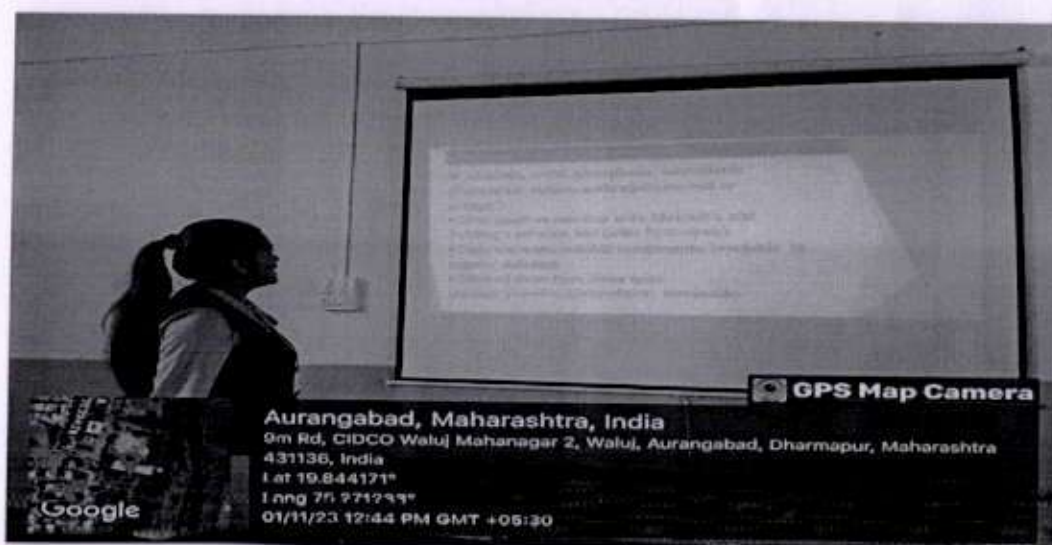

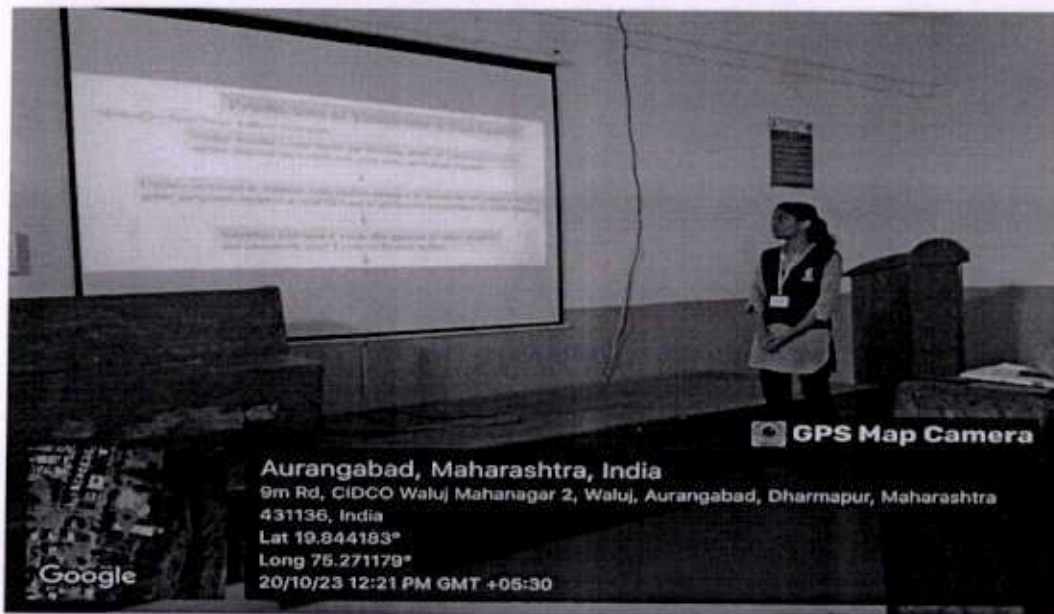
