#### 2. Brief description of the activity conducted:

The guest lecture on organ donation was organized on the 20th of September 2023, under the aegis of the National Service Scheme (NSS) committee. The session, organized by NSS Coordinator Dr. R.B. Chavhan, aimed to demystify organ donation and underscore its critical importance in saving lives.

Mr. Sahil Pithore commenced the lecture with an introduction and welcome address to guest Mr. Subhash R. Gheware woking as Medical Social Worker at Kmalnayan Bajaj Hospital Chhtrapati Sambhajinagar. Dr. S.S.Angadi Principal Dr. V.P.patil, Dr, G.A. Vaishnav, Dr. A.S.Narute were present on the dais along with guest speaker. This inauguration was followed by felicitation of resource person with sapling as a token of love and appreciation.

Mr. Subhash started his session with introduction to organ donation, outlining its significance in modern healthcare. He detailed how organ donation works, the types of organs that can be donated, and the eligibility criteria for donors. Emphasis was placed on the fact that a single organ donor can save up to eight lives, highlighting the profound impact of this altruistic act.

To provide a comprehensive understanding, Mr. Gheware included real-life case studies of individuals whose lives were transformed by organ transplants. These poignant stories illustrated the dire need for more donors and demonstrated the real-world benefits of organ donation. He also presented statistical data showing the current state of organ donation in India and globally, drawing attention to the gap between the number of patients waiting for transplants and the available donors.

A significant portion of the lecture focused on dispelling common myths and misconceptions about organ donation.

As a medical Social Worker Mr. Subhash addressed concerns such as the fear of medical neglect for registered donors and the belief that certain religions prohibit organ donation. By providing factual information and citing examples from various religious texts, he reassured the audience and encouraged them to consider becoming donors.

The interactive nature of the session was enhanced through a Q&A segment, where students and faculty members posed questions and shared their thoughts. Mr. Subhash Gheware answered queries ranging from the technicalities of the donation process to the emotional aspects faced by donor families and recipients. This interactive dialogue fostered a deeper understanding and addressed personal apprehensions about organ donation.

The session included an informational video from the Indian Society of Organ Transplantation, which illustrated the process of organ harvesting and transplantation. This visual aid helped participants grasp the medical procedures involved and the stringent ethical guidelines followed to ensure fair and just practices in organ donation.

Dr. S.S. Angadi concluded the session and delivered presidential address by confirming that, NSS Volunteers of the institute were distribute informational pamphlets, containing detailed guidelines on how to register as an organ donor, the legal implications, and the support available for donor families. These pamphlets served as a take-home resource for attendees to further explore the subject and discuss it with their families.

#### 3. Impact of the activity (Outcomes for students and/or staff):

The guest lecture on organ donation had a profound and multifaceted impact on both students and faculty members.

Increased Awareness: The primary outcome was a significant increase in awareness regarding organ donation. Participants gained a thorough understanding of the organ donation process, its importance, and the life-saving potential it holds. This newfound knowledge helped dispel long-standing myths and reduced the stigma associated with organ donation.

Encouraged Participation: The session successfully encouraged several students and faculty members to consider registering as organ donors. The inspirational stories and statistical data presented during the lecture motivated attendees to contemplate their role in this life-saving practice. By the end of the session, many participants expressed their willingness to pledge as organ donors, marking a positive shift in attitude towards organ donation.














