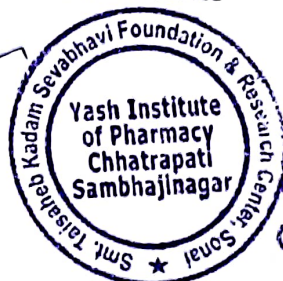

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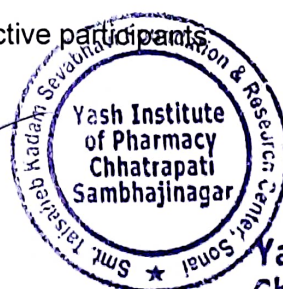
Blood Donation by Students

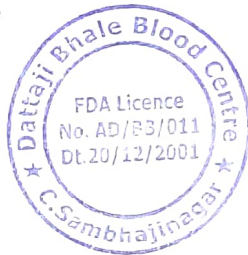

An educational visit to **Shri Dattaji Bhale Blood Bank**, located at **Dr. Hedgewar Hospital, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar**, a **350-bed multi-specialty healthcare facility**, was organized for **B. Pharmacy First Year students** on **7th January 2026**. The visit aimed to provide students with practical exposure to blood bank operations and to enhance their understanding of blood donation, safety, and quality assurance practices.

During the visit, the blood bank staff provided comprehensive information about the **organizational setup and functioning** of the blood bank. Students were guided through the various stages involved in blood banking services.

The staff explained the **donor selection criteria**, which included parameters such as age, body weight, general health conditions, and detailed medical history to ensure donor and recipient safety. Students were also informed about the **donor registration process**, documentation requirements, and the importance of maintaining accurate records.

Further, the students were introduced to **pre-donation screening procedures**, including hemoglobin testing and basic health examinations conducted prior to blood donation. These procedures were explained in detail to emphasize their role in ensuring donor eligibility and blood safety.

The **blood collection process** was demonstrated by trained personnel, highlighting the use of **sterile and aseptic techniques** to prevent contamination and ensure donor safety. Students were also briefed about **blood storage conditions**, proper **labeling**, and **quality control measures** followed in the blood bank to maintain the integrity and safety of collected blood.

A total of **63 students**, accompanied by two faculty members, **Mr. Abhay Joshi and Ms. Ayushi Kanhed**, participated in the visit.

- Helped students correlate theoretical concepts taught in subjects such as Human Anatomy & Physiology and Pharmaceutical Practice with real-life applications.
- Created awareness about ethical practices and regulatory aspects involved in blood banking services.
- Motivated students to appreciate the importance of voluntary blood donation and social responsibility in healthcare.
- Improved students' professional attitude, observational skills, and interest in healthcare-related services.
- Strengthened experiential learning by bridging the gap between classroom learning and practical exposure.
